Sanjay warning on infiltration

JAWAHARNAGAR, Nov. 21—Mr Sanjay Gandhi and the Indian Youth Congress president, Mrs Ambika Soni, today cautioned the National Students' Union of India (NSUI) against opportunistic politics and infiltration by Opposition parties, particularly those who were communal and had a programme of indoctrination.

They were addressing a meeting of the north-eastern unit of the NSUI at the Veterinary College auditorium within the Assam Agricultural University campus.

Mr Sanjay Gandhi asked the

NSUI to build a strong students movement at all levels but warned it against extending its activities to districts and blocks by establishing committees. If it did so, it might come in clash with the IYC, he added.

He said the main job of the NSUI was to look after the problems of students and prevent their exploitation by the parties which were not at all interested in their welfare.

He suggested that the NSUI should build a strong base in schools to enable it to launch and

lead a powerful movement right upto the university level.

IYC president Ambika Soni asked the students' union to remain vigilant against exploitation and see that politics in India became work-oriented instead of power-oriented.

Miss Gitanjali Sharma, president of the NSUI, assured that her organisation would always have close co-ordination with the Youth Congress and leave no stone unturned to carry out its directives successfully.
